
EQUINE SAMPLE COLLECTION AND ANALYSIS PROCEDURE

DESIGNED TO:

- Ensure security of the sample during and after collection
- Ensure sample anonymity during the analysis process
- Protect the rights of people and horses

SAMPLE COLLECTION

A credentialed Doping Control Officer (DCO) is responsible for managing the sample collection process, which includes notification of sample collection and provision of a sample.




SAMPLE TRANSPORTATION

Samples and documentation are sent to accredited laboratory in a manner that protects their integrity, identity, and security.




SAMPLE INSPECTION

A and B samples arrive at laboratory. Inspected for any evidence of tampering or leaking that may compromise sample integrity.



SAMPLE ANALYSIS

A sample is opened and analyzed. B sample securely stored.



SAMPLE RESULTS

The A sample results reported to enforcement agency. Responsible persons and/or owner has the right to pay for B sample analysis. B sample results reported (see Results Management Infographic).



SAMPLE STORAGE

For deterrence purposes, samples may be frozen and reanalyzed at any time.
Samples may be stored for up to 10 years.



SAMPLE DISPOSAL

Samples are disposed of at the conclusion of the sample storage period.
